#### Coordinate with Embassy of Nepal

- Our executive team will coordinate closely with the Embassy of Nepal in Washington DC to resolve issues of people of Nepali Origin living in Colorado.
- We will work closely with the Nepali Ambassador to bring temporary office in Colorado every other year.



#### Sign MOU with Colorado Businesses

- Our executive team will sign Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with a minimum of 25 Colorado local business to provide exclusive discount for registered NRNA members.
- Business includes, but not limited to, local restaurants, beauty salons, grocery stores, accounting firms, insurance businesses, etc.



#### Organize Nepal Day Conference

- Our executive team will coordinate with the Colorado Governor's Office to setup Nepal Day conference every other year for tourism development & to encourage cultural exchange between Nepal and Colorado.
- This one day conference will provide an opportunity for Nepali living in Colorado to meet and greet, and have live interaction with Colorado Governor & local US house of the representatives.



#### Grant and funding for Local Community Building

- Our executive team will coordinate with Office of the Governor to receive grant for local minority community and work closely with Nepali Ghar Community Center project.
- Our executive community will form a Grant and Finance sub-comittee under President's chairmanship to idendify funding sources for local minority Nepali community by working closely with the city, county, and state offices.
- The Grant and Finance sub-committee will research on possible funding sources for non-profit 501(C) organizations (Colorado Gives Day, Amazon Smile, and Corporate citizenship grants).



#### Set Up NRNA Colorado Chapter Priorities

NRNA Colorado Chapter will set up priorities of tasks at the beginning of the term 2021- 2023 based on local Nepali community needs. New executive members will be assigned to different regions of the State of Colorado to gather public opinion and feedback within 30 days of election results.

#### NRNA Colorado Chapter Community Satisfaction

NRNA Colorado Chapter will conduct a satisfaction survey every year with the local Nepali population and address the issues that are below satisfaction level to meet the community expectation.

- 9. To achieve continuation of Nepali citizenship to NRN or dual citizenship to PNO. To represent and promote the interests of NRN in the Nepal and elsewhere.
- 10.To raise and donate financial resources nationally and internationally.
- 11. To support and assist in the humanitarian and relief work during the time of disaster and human suffering including but not limited to any sort of natural calamity directly or in cooperation with other national and global organizations or individuals for achieving the objectives of NRN USA.



#### The primary goals of the NRN USA shall be as follows:

- 1. To function as national Board of NRN USA and national coordination council of its international organization NRNA ICC
- 2. To represent and promote the interest, right, privileges, and immunities of NRN in the United States and Nepal.
